Correnso & Project Martha Community Meeting

The six-monthly Correnso and Project Martha Community Meeting was held on Thursday the 14th of March. Proposed Change to the Martha Mine Mineral Zone: Submission Period Ended

The Waihi North Project

The Waihi North Project was first announced in June 2021, with a resource consent application lodged a year later in June 2022. Since that time, we have been undertaking work to answer a Request for Information (RFI) that was subsequently received from the Hauraki District and Waikato Regional councils.

With the recent announcement of the Fast-track Approvals Bill by the New Zealand Government, OceanaGold has now decided to pause the existing RFI process for the Waihi North Project while we learn more about Fast-track.

- 6.1 <u>Outdoor Recreation Hub</u>
 - Awaiting Lottery Community Facilities Fund decision regarding pump track funding, expected in June 2024.
 - Ruth Vivian (HDC) will apply to Lion Foundation for seed funding of \$30k for the hub in April (decision made 8 weeks from application). Awaiting specific resolution granted by HDC before applying)
 - PB researching COGS funding for stage 2 of the hub (round 2, opens 23 October, closes 20 November 2024, decision 19 March 2025)
 - James Searle Say Foundation funding is via Perpetual Guardian, they require an IRD number to register on their portal. Funding round opens in September, closes in October.

Kia ora Anne Marie, Further to my email, we've received some good news! The Lions Club of Waihi has agreed to sponsor one hoop. We also have secured funding from the Hauraki Maori Trust board for four more hoops (so five in total), which is ideal, as we can run a much better community service with six hoops.

We are therefore seeking funding for one more hoop. Would the Waihi Community Forum be interested in sponsoring this last hoop? This is the only programme in Waihi that caters to this age group, and we plan to run it annually.

The hoops will be strategically stored in the Sport n' Action cupboard at the Events Centre, ensuring their availability for future programmes run by us or other community groups via Sport n' Action. We will be able to have six at these sessions and plan on keeping fees affordable for our whanau by applying to Hauraki District Council's Waihi Ward to ask for a remission on Event Centre hire costs.

This programme will significantly benefit our local community and fill a muchneeded gap in a sport that has become very popular these past few years and continues to remain strong. It will also keep these Tamariki in good standing when they start college and continue with basketball there, a popular sport amongst our Rangatahi.

We would ensure the Waihi Community Forum was mentioned in all publicity promoting this after-school programme, if the forum was interested.
